The VCI Process

Phase I: Shared Learning Experience

The church establishes a team that includes the pastor and 2-5 laity, that meets with teams from other nearby churches. The Larger Church Path is 9 Saturday learning sessions. This experience will help your team learn key concepts and best practices-tapping into the discoveries of other effective churches and church leaders— and then apply them in their own lives in order to develop as church leaders. As a result the church will develop a cadre of leaders to help it more effectively carry out its mission and become more fruitful.

All sessions are 5 hours long with each session consisting of teaching, spiritual reflection, interaction with the ideas and concepts and group sharing.

Phase II: Consultation Preparation and Event

Phase II is 4 to 6 months process culminating in the Consultation Event . Prior to the Consultation Event a team of trained pastors and lay persons receive documents about the congregation. During the event, the team determines strengths, growth areas, and strategic recommendations, called prescriptions, for the church to pursue in order to move to even greater effectiveness. The church will receive 5 prescriptions in each area.

During the 4 to 6 month preparation and consultation event process, the pastor will be part of a peer

Phase III: Implementation of Prescriptions

Each congregation voting 'yes' to the consultation report and its prescriptions will be assigned a coach to help with implementing the prescriptions.

A major focus of the shared Learning Experience for participants is personal growth.

Participants read a book each month pertaining to each session's topic. Those on the church team meet at least once between each session to debrief the session, discuss the readings and see how each person is doing applying the concepts.

Once Phase I is completed, the VCI facilitator, staff, coach, and District Superintendent will discern who will be invited to be a part of Phase II.

Fremont United Methodist Church has completed Phase I. We are now in Phase II.

mentoring group with other participating pastors. The church and its leaders complete preconsultation reports, documents, a worship and provide video's of its worship experiences. The Consultation Event is what actually begins momentum for healthy change in the congregation.

In the 4 to 6 weeks after the Consultation Event the pastor and congregation will decide during 2 or 3 town hall meetings whether to accept or reject the consultation report, including its prescriptions. This decision is finalized in a called church conference.

What is the VCI Team doing?

Over the next few months the VCI Team will be working on a self-study of Fremont UMC. Here is a timeline of what we are doing.
